2015-16 Activity Report of the Friends of Kurth Kiln for the Annual General Meeting 8 October 2016 at Kurth Kiln

The year 2015-2016 was again an active period for the Friends of Kurth Kiln. During the 12 months from 1 July 2015 to 30 June 2016 the following events and activities are noted:

- **11 regular monthly meetings** / **working bees** were held and ongoing maintenance was carried out as listed below: The meeting on 14 May was cancelled due to the Parks Victoria Volunteer Day event
 - Checking out the condition of the local walking tracks, cleaning the display windows and the Interpretation Boards and talking to the casual visitors.
 - Storm damage to two Display Panels on the Thornton Track has been repaired
 - The badly weathered Interpretation Boards at the Kiln and in the Caretakers Compound have been taken to MSC for re-coating and refitted. Funded by the MW Community Support Grant
 - The badly weathered and vandal damaged Welcome Sign at the Thornton Walk has been updated and replaced by MSC, and the support structure repainted.
 - The local Parks Victoria Friends Christmas Break-up was held on 5 December at Mortimer Picnic Ground. Parks Victoria provided the various meats, bread and drinks, while the participants brought salads and deserts.
 - The routine preservative painting of the Huts has been completed again, except for the Big Shed side facing South were ladders are needed. Parks Victoria assistance will be needed there.
 - The Caretakers Compound Picket Fence was painted by Henriettes TAFE Students.
 - Glen, our Vice President, is also our Maintenance Manager and looks after the regular grass mowing on the site, which can be quite a chore in summer time. It is a pleasure to see it looking so nice and tidy.

- The December and June issues of our Newsletter THE KILN have been produced by Meredith, .
- A convenient portable Pull-Up Banner was created by Laurence for easier promotion display.

• Grant Works

- Confirmation of our \$4,900 Yarra Ranges 2016 Heritage and Development Grant for the publication of a "Walking for Pleasure" booklet was received at a Yarra Ranges celebration of successful 2016 grants event on Monday 12 October 2015 at the Mooroolbark Community Centre. The project is scheduled for completion in November 2016, with a Book Launch planned for 12 November at Kurth Kiln.
- The \$4000 DEPI Communities for Nature grant for Re-vegetation with 1000 plants along Scout Loop Track between the new campsites was completed on 18 September 2015, with the help of the Cockatoo and Hoddles Creek Primary School Students.
- The Threatened Species Protection Initiative grant application for the propagation of Tall Astelia in Kurth Kiln Regional Park has been approved
- A \$2150 funding application for the 2016 Heritage Festival has been lodged by David, and approval in principle has been received
- Raewyn, our treasurer, has applied for Melbourne Water Community Support funding, which has been approved for \$550.00.
- Our application to Community Heritage Grants 2015 National Library of Australia, for \$6325 funding for conservation work on the historic Charcoal Grader has not been approved
- A Letter of Support has been written in September for the Victorian National Parks Association's 'Audio Monitoring of Birds in Bunyip State Park and Kurth Kiln Regional Park' project, as part of a wider Social Impact Study on our Natural Environment
- As part of our Parks Victoria grant to convert Annexe 03 into a dedicated display room for large artefacts the odds and ends that used to be there have been shifted to Parks Victoria's big shed. On Saturday 30 January 7 members installed shelving in a dedicated corner and sorted out the items.

• Festival and Events

- On Wednesday 8 July the Friends of Kurth Kiln gave a PowerPoint presentation about Kurth Kiln to the members of the Probus Club of Croydon.
- Robin Barden, Branch Manager, Lilydale Community Library invited the Friends of Kurth Kiln to give a talk about the story of Kurth Kiln. A PowerPoint presentation was given at the library on Wednesday 12 August 2015.
