Meeting with retired Forests Commission Victoria Peter McHugh Saturday 20 October 2018



In pouring rain, on the morning of Saturday 20 October Alfred and Ursula meet Peter McHugh at Kurth Kiln. Peter was a forester with the Forests Commission Victoria from the late 1970s and has recently retired. He remembers many things from his days working at Kurth Kiln and promised to send some of his research and photos. We gave him books and the latest calendar, which will go into the Forests Commission Retired Personnel Association Museum in Beechworth.
